# Who Governs the BCTBA?

Teachers and librarians serve on the Buckeye Children's and Teen Book Award Council. Current sponsoring agencies are:

- State Library of Ohio
- Ohio Council of the International Reading Association (OCIRA)
- Ohio Council of Teachers of English Language Arts (OCTELA)
- Ohio Educational Library Media Association (OELMA)
- Ohio Library Council (OLC)
- and the Kent State University School of Library and Information Science.

Each agency is allowed up to two members on the Council. Each agency contributes \$350 to the Council annually. The Council meets twice a year and communicates frequently between meetings; its primary job is to prepare the master voting list and post it on the website after nominations are in, and then tabulate and announce the results. The Council also promotes the award, and maintains the BCTBA website. The BCTBA archives are kept in the Reinberger Children's Library Center at Kent State University School of Library and Information Science.

## How Does The Buckeye Book Awards Program Work?

Ohio students in grades K-12, in any school or homeschooled, nominate their favorite books for the Buckeye and then vote for their choices. The Buckeyes are one of the only State Reader's Choice Awards in the country where books are both nominated and voted on by students, not adults. The students do all nominating and voting online, at **www.bcbookaward.info**. Students may vote from home, school or the public library. They may vote individually or as part of a group at school or the public library. Teachers and librarians may submit votes on behalf of students.

#### Buckeye Awards Timeline

March 15-March 10: Students nominate their favorite books (published within the last two years, and not part of a series that has already won the award. Past winners are listed on the website.). Nominations are now open year-round, except for a 5-day transition period in March to close one year's nomination period and open the next.

<u>April</u>: The top five nominated books for each grade range are posted to the website.

<u>May-August</u>: Students read the nominated books, if they haven't already, and encourage their friends to read them too. <u>September 1 to November 10</u>: Students vote for their favorites of the five nominees.

After December 1: The winners are announced!

### How Public Librarians Can Participate

- Create a bulletin board or display to promote the Buckeye Award process and to encourage students to nominate/ vote. Write reviews or make video book trailers of the nominees.
- Put the BCTBA website in your email sig file; link to it on your library's webpage or blog. Like BCTBA on Facebook and promote the Buckeyes on your social media feeds.
- Print out the ballot bookmarks from the BCTBA website & put them in the nominated books.
- Booktalk the nominees at summer reading program school visits and back-to-school events.
- Use the nominees in storytimes and book club programs.
- Think of other creative ideas to engage children and teens with reading, nominating, and voting!
